

DACAMERA YOUNG ARTIST PROGRAM

The DACAMERA Young Artist Program is a fellowship program for emerging professional instrumentalists, vocalists, and composers. The goal of the program is to encourage musicians to develop the skills necessary to become passionate, forward-thinking and community-focused "citizen artists;" that is, artists who reimagine the traditional notions of their music-making and embrace the role of contributing to society through the transformative power of their art and proactive social engagement.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Candidates for the DACAMERA Young Artist Program are Houston-based emerging professionals who:

- are interested in performing solo, chamber, and jazz repertoire throughout the Houston community
- are interested in working with teachers in public schools to develop lessons that utilize music to enrich the study of core-foundation subjects
- have completed at least a bachelor's degree in music
- are 30 years old or under
- are able to commit to in-person and virtual visits in Houston schools, to perform in concerts throughout the Houston community, and to participate in career development workshops*

*The Young Artist schedule is designed to allow participants the flexibility to perform as freelancers, maintain a private studio etc.



EDUCATION TRAINING AND EXPERIENCE

Young Artists lead DACAMERA's flagship education program is Music Encounters, an arts integration curriculum that uses music as a vehicle to teach lessons in foundation subjects including language arts, math, science, social studies, and more.

Music Encounters are developed in consultation with public and private school administrators and classroom teachers and are aligned with TEKS (Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills) standards. Rather than large-scale assemblies in a school's cafeteria, these lessons occur in classrooms, allowing students individual interactions with professional musicians, and serve to augment the teaching and learning that is already occurring in the classroom.



PERFORMANCE OPPORTUNITIES

In addition to the work in schools, DACAMERA Young Artists also program, and perform in, a wide range of free community concerts.

These programs, which number around 50 per season, frequently occur in non-traditional performance venues – libraries, hospitals, and community centers – and are designed to engage audiences that often do not have the ability to attend a traditional concert. DACAMERA Young Artists perform in A Little Day Music, Houston's longest running free concert series. At The Menil Collection and Museum of Fine Arts, Houston through a series of performances that feature unconventional, interactive concert formats and fun, adventurous musical selections. The programs are often designed to celebrate specific artwork on display in the museum. DACAMERA Young Artists regularly perform in Harris County Public Libraries and other locations throughout the season.

APPLICATION PROCESS FOR INSTRUMENTALISTS AND SINGERS

[NON-JAZZ]

- · One-page cover letter
- Résumé
- Repertoire list (solo and chamber music)
- Letter of recommendation written by a teacher, mentor, etc. (letter should be sent directly from the reference to <u>eparker@dacamera.com</u>)

Audition Requirements for instrumentalists and singers:

Each audition will last approximately 15 minutes and will follow this general format:

- Excerpt One (5-6 minutes)
 - Brief introduction of the work as if you are presenting it to a class of 25 third graders
 - A 4-5 minute excerpt of the work
- Excerpt Two (5-6 minutes)
 - Brief introduction of the work as if you are presenting it to an experienced concert-audience
 - A 4-5 minute excerpt of the work
- Interview (4-5 minutes)

Please note:

- Applicants are encouraged to select repertoire that is relevant to the Young Artist Program.
 - (Example: chamber music and solo repertoire instead of orchestral excerpts.)
- The two excerpts must be of contrasting styles.
- Applicants are expected to supply their own accompanist as needed.

Audition Requirements for jazz combo:

Each audition will last approximately 15 minutes and will follow this general format:

- Set One (5-6 minutes)
 - o Brief introduction of the work as if you are presenting it to a class of 25 third graders
 - o A 4-5 minute excerpt of the work
- Set Two (5-6 minutes)
 - Brief introduction of the work as if you are presenting it to an experienced concert-audience
 - A 4-5 minute excerpt of the work
- Interview (4-5 minutes)

Please note:

 Applicants are encouraged to perform selections from jazz repertoire with contrasting tempos and styles which include at least two choruses of improvisation.
